- Brexit reform of UK Procurement Regime.
- Single Act of Parliament for all procurement regimes.
- Procurement accounts for approx. £407 Bn of public expenditure.
- The UK's programme of procurement reform represents the biggest change to public procurement law in England, Wales and Northern Ireland in a generation.
- The new Procurement Act 2023 will come into force on 24 February 2025.
- Aims to speed-up, simplify, modernise, deliver value for money and create greater opportunities for SMEs.

## Act & Regulations

- In March 2024, the Procurement Regulations 2024 were laid in Parliament these were Affirmed on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2024.
- This Statutory Instrument adds detail to key elements of the skeleton legal structure introduced in the Procurement Act 2023.
- In particular, more detail is provided on:
  - The "Central Digital Platform" which will be a single website, replacing Contracts Finder and Find A Tender.
  - The Notices which must be published on this platform.
  - Light Touch Contracts.
  - The definition of Central Government Entities (which are subject to a different advertising threshold for goods and services).







- The intention is for the Central Digital Platform to be broader than this, and to be a one-stop source of information





#### Direct Awards – PA23 (Chapter 3)

The Procurement Act classifies Direct Award into three cases, using three Sections:

- Section 41: Direct Award in Special Cases
- Section 42: Direct Award to Protect Life
- Section 43: Switching to Direct Award

#### Sting in the Tail – No more hidden contracts!

#### The new requirements will be as follows:

- 1. Issue Transparency Notice prior to award (not for user choice)
- 2. Publish a Contract Award Notice
- 3. Wait for the Standstill Period to end
- (No standstill under Section 42 awards, call-offs, dynamic market awards, and "light touch" contracts)
- 4. Sign the Contract
- 5. Publish a Contract Details Notice




#### Frameworks

- The Act makes minor changes to the operation of Frameworks and introduces a new "Open Framework" mechanism.
- **Traditional Frameworks** set up via a tender process, typically four years in duration, and then closed to new entrants are still permitted.
- The Act makes it very clear that a **Competitive Selection Process** (what we currently call a Further Competition) should be the default means for appointing a supplier via a Framework.
- Direct Call-Off (referred to as "award without competition") is permitted only if:
  - The Framework itself sets out all the core terms for call-off contracts, and:
  - There is an "objective mechanism" for supplier selection.

(In practice this is the same as the rules for direct call-off which have applied since 2015).




#### New concept of Open Framework S49 PA23

Definition:


 "An "open framework" is a scheme of frameworks that provides for the award of successive frameworks on substantially the same terms".






